There are better ways of solving disagreements. d) Be truthful and honest. e) Abide by school rules.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To be educated in a pleasant and safe environment 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) Take care of all school property. b) Abide by rules associated with dress, behaviour and safety. c) Keep the premises and grounds tidy. d) Respect the possessions of others. e) Refrain from habits which are harmful to health and welfare. <p>Under Occupational health and Safety Legislation, students have responsibility to report any hazards to school staff.</p>
